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*Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources*

Since the establishment of Yogeshwari Education Society and Swami Ramanand Teerth Mahavidyalaya, it has been the policy of the institution to bear the financial burden of the institution without relying too much on government grants. For this, funds were raised by appealing to the well-wishers of the society, education lovers, entrepreneurs, social activists and stakeholders of the institute. Society used to run the educational institute by running some activities based on these donations and grants received from the stake holders. In the pre-independence period, the necessary cooperation from the then government may not have been met and it was not feasible to expect such a thing. In other words, taking government grants would have increased government control and interference and would have hampered the achievement of the institutional objectives. Some of the objectives were to establish a freedom movement, to create patriotic citizens and to prove to them that they could fight against the government. These matters were in direct opposition to the then government. Therefore, government grants should be avoided. But Yogeshwari Education Society continued the same tradition in the post-independence period also. Therefore, the policy of connecting stakeholders and various sections of the society and running the educational activities of the institute on their strong basis continued. Government grants were taken only if required.

In the post-independence period, the country has adopted a liberal policy on grants and the University Grants Commission and the Central and State Governments have given incentive grants to various educational initiatives. Further, the government increased the monthly salary grants and non-salary grants. This greatly reduced the burden on the organization. However, the institute maintained its strong ties with the community and continued to support them financially.

From the very beginning, the organization has been pursuing a policy of raising funds from savings by relying on austerity measures. Today, this policy is strictly followed. Extreme simplicity, extravagance or unwarranted financial wasteful activities or methods are torn apart. The organization adopted and maintained a policy of spending on the very essentials by limiting needs and facilities.

Many of the founders and directors of the institute are expected to remain teachers of the college. They used to accept only the required amount as salary. The policy was to return the remaining amount to the institute. Also, the services required for college educational activities should be provided through the available resources, materials and premises. Since self-reliance and service-minded attitude, some services and facilities should be provided by the college itself. The policy of saving in the cost incurred from this has been followed and is being followed.


The college and the institute have been making efforts to meet the day to day needs of the college and the educational institution at the local level by accepting donations from the philanthropic community. Attempts are also made to generate income by providing necessary services, awareness and guidance to various sections of the society. Attempts are also made to raise funds through Street Plays, Dramatization. The Dramatics Department of the college takes the initiative for this. Attempts are also made from time to time to raise funds by experimenting with singing programme by college singer teachers and music experts.

The children of the hostel are given the rite of running a backyard garden through hard work. In this backyard, the vegetables required for the hostel are taken. For the hostel, many charitable congregations help by taking responsibility for the food on their special day.

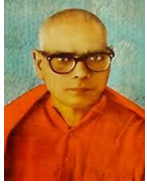
The hostel, college building and college hall are rented for various social and personal activities, celebrations, various government and semi-government examinations, lectures, wedding ceremonies. Large commercial plays and various socio-cultural activities are rented out of the college hall and grounds. From this the college and Yogeshwari Education Society get income.

Yogeshwari Education Society was established in the pre-independence period by patriotic social workers to educate the rural people and unite them for freedom struggle, to awaken the national thought and patriotism among them and through it to accelerate the freedom movement. The objective was to create self-reliant, self-dependent and employable citizens in order to increase the income of the society and ultimately of the country. It also aimed to create character-rich and capable citizens for building a better society and country. Therefore, in addition to developing the skills needed to make a living, it was also important for the operators of the time to build in the next generation the capacity needed to create employment and entrepreneurship. The goal of independence was achieved with the attainment of independence. But all the other objectives were necessary in the future as well. Accordingly, the institution and the college had continued their journey. As a result, many students came out of the college who made great strides in many fields and made their mark in agriculture, industry, business, trade and administrative and educational services. All these students today are fulfilling their responsibilities and roles in the society, in the country and outside the country with great potential, have become self-reliant and are adding value to the gross income of the country. All these students are passionate about the college and are in constant touch with the college. Attends various programs and activities in the college and also contributes. At the same time, provides financial support to the Y.E.S. and to the college by making large donations. The financial support is sought by appealing to various industry sectors, entrepreneurs and financial institutions. Alumni gatherings, parent gatherings are organized for their interactive activities, at the same time they are appealed for financial support for various educational activities.

Recently, the college celebrated the year 2019-20 as the golden jubilee year. Most of these students attended various programs organized at that time, especially the alumni meet and the inaugural function of the Golden Jubilee, and they made a lot of financial contributions by donating to the college. Many philanthropists, entrepreneurs, charitable organizations, industries, stakeholders and alumni of the society have also given generous donations to the college and Yogeshwari Education Society in the academic year 2020-21.
